Application fees are \$100 for Canadian citizens and permanent residents, and \$130 for international students. ## Direct Entry (High school students)

If you are coming to university directly from high school or have completed less than one year of university studies, you'll take the Direct Entry route.

### Direct Entry Routes:

#### University 1

- Provides flexibility if you are undecided or choosing between programs.
- A great place to start if you require one or more year(s) of study for your program of choice.
- Ideal if you don't yet meet the admission requirements for your program of choice.

## Faculty Entry

- Provides direct admission into certain programs that offer a Direct Entry option.
- An ideal option if you are academically strong in the prerequisite courses for your chosen program and meet all admission requirements.

## Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB)

The University of Manitoba recognizes the Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) programs for admission, scholarships and university transfer credit.

## Advanced Entry (Transfer Students)

If you have completed one or more years of university study (24 credit hours or more), you can apply through the Advanced Entry route. External transfer students may receive a maximum of two years (60 credit hours) of transferable credit to be applied towards a UM degree, subject to faculty regulations and requirements.



Admission and scholarship offers are sent in May and June. Congratulations—accept your offer!



DIRECT ENTRY ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants applying directly from high school or with less than one year (<24 credit hours) of university studies. Applicants must meet both of the following requirements to gain admission to UM.

1. General Admission Requirement: Manitoba high school graduation with 5 full S, G, U or C credits at the Grade 12 level.

2. Program Specific Requirement: See program chart below.

# ADMISSION PROCESS (INTERNATIONAL)

## English language proficiency

If English isn't your first language, or if you're from a country where English isn't the primary language, you might need to demonstrate English language proficiency before you're admitted. You can demonstrate English proficiency in a number of different ways:

### OPTION 1: WRITE A TEST

- International English Language Testing System (IELTS)
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)
- Duolingo English Test

### OPTION 2: QUALIFY FOR A WAIVER

- Graduation from a Canadian curriculum secondary school with a year 12 English literature grade of 75 per cent or higher.
- Successful completion of three consecutive years of school in Canada or in a country where English is a primary language.
- Ten consecutive years of residency in Canada or in a country where English is a primary language.
- Achieve a grade of four or greater on the International Baccalaureate Higher Level English course, or a grade of four or greater on the Advanced Placement English examination (Language Composition; Literature and Composition).

For eligible Indigenous students, financial sponsorship may include tuition, fees, mandatory books, supplies, allowance and travel costs.

- **Treaty/Status First Nation students** can apply for sponsorship. Students should contact their Education Authority, Band or Tribal Council from their community.

- **Inuit students** should contact designated organizations or regional Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) to determine eligibility for sponsorship.

- **Métis students** entering full-time studies may be eligible for sponsorship. Students are advised to contact the MMF Post-Secondary Education Support Program.

## Canadian student loans

Students with a status of Canadian Citizen, Permanent Resident, or Refugee can apply to their provincial government for student aid.

# TUITION AND FEES

The cost of a university education is more than just tuition and books. Estimate your living costs to create an education budget: rent, damage deposit, housing insurance, utilities, child care, family expenses, groceries and vehicle costs. Don’t be discouraged by the cost of education, especially if your chosen career is in demand. Most students pay for post-secondary education with a combination of funds from many sources: savings, scholarships, bursaries, sponsorship, wages and loans.
